

5. ROSSALL STREET – PROPOSED PEDESTRIAN ISLAND

The purpose of this report is to request that the Board recommend to the City Services Committee the construction of a pedestrian island in Rossall Street in response to information from Rangī Ruru Girls' School regarding its pedestrian entrance onto Rossall Street.

At the Works and Traffic Safety Committee meeting on 19 June, the Committee requested that the Area Engineer consult with Rangī Ruru and report back to the Board on their proposed developments, that would affect the siting of a pedestrian island in Rossall Street between Rhodes Street and Helmores Lane. The School's Business Manager advises that the pedestrian entrance onto Rossall will stay in its present position. He also believes that the new boarders hostel in Rhodes Street (accommodating 130 staff and pupils) will create a need when it opens for a pedestrian crossing facility for boarders wishing to go to the shops on a daily basis.

The proposed location as shown on the **attached** plan is in the best position to serve pedestrians going to and from the Rangī Ruru facilities.

Recommendation: That the construction of a pedestrian island in Rossall Street as shown on the plan, be recommended to the City Services Committee for approval.

Chairman's Recommendation: That the foregoing recommendation be adopted.
