

20. TEESDALE STREET – PROPOSED GIVE WAY CONTROL

The purpose of this report is to request that the Board recommends to the Council the installation of a Give Way control against Teesdale Street at its intersection with Roydvale Avenue.

A paved threshold and narrowing in Teesdale Street at its intersection with Roydvale Avenue was proposed in the 2000/01 Capital Works Neighbourhood Improvement Programme. The previous Board resolved that the work be held over until the Living Streets workshop was held. After the workshop in May, the Area Engineer contacted the residents on all sides of the intersection to obtain their views on the proposed work. All residents expressed the opinion that they would like the physical structure of the intersection to remain as it is. Some residents thought that a Give Way restriction against Teesdale Street would be a satisfactory safety improvement.

The reallocation of the funds budgeted for the original project will be the subject of a separate report to be submitted to the December meeting of the Works and Traffic Safety Committee (or its reconstituted equivalent).

Recommendation: That it be recommended to the Council that a Give Way control be placed against Teesdale Street at its intersection with Roydvale Avenue.
