### 14. CORRESPONDENCE

## 14.1 CHRISTCHURCH EAST SCHOOL

The following letter of appreciation has been received from Marg Robson, Principal of Christchurch East School.

## 14.2 NANCY'S WOODLAND, SOUTH HAGLEY PARK

The following letter has been received from the Chairperson of the Deans Avenue Precinct Society seeking the Board's assistance for enhancement projects in Nancy's Woodland, South Hagley Park.

"We thank you sincerely for taking the time to visit Nancy's Woodland with us on Wednesday 29 August. Further to that visit, we list below the items we would like to see pursued to enhance this area for the enjoyment of the people of Christchurch and visitors from elsewhere. Following your suggestions, we would favour a co-operative effort from your Board and the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board in the enhancement of Nancy's Woodland. To this end a copy of this letter has been sent to the Chairperson of that Board, Mr Mike Mora.

# 1. Daffodil Planting

Most of the existing plants are white-flowered Narsissi and not the more colourful yellow trumpets or true daffodils. We suggest further more liberal planting of the latter (see Hagley Park Management Plan 1991, p.63).

## 2. Walking Path

An established "desire line" path traverses the Woodland between Riccarton and Deans Avenues. In winter this is muddy with pools of water here and there. It is desirable to surface this path with stone chip to produce an all-weather surface.

# 3. Wood/Soil/etc Stockpiles

This area detracts from the visual interpretation in the Woodland. It is desirable to confine this area and screen it from view with appropriate planting compatible with the "English" woodland (see Hagley M.P. 1991, p.25)

### 4. Washbourne Stream

At present this stream (unfortunately referred to as "Riccarton Main Drain") is dammed near Riccarton Avenue as part of a project of potential enhancement. As it stands, it is both a hazard (including two bridges with dangerous approaches) and a rubbish dump. The stream (see map in Hagley M.P. 1991, P.2) is an important asset of Nancy's Woodland and its future enhancement, including any planting should be discussed fully before any implementation occurs.

# 5. Cherry Trees

There is ample scope to plant appropriate cherry trees along the Deans Avenue frontage, in keeping with those along the margin of North Hagley.

## 6. Picnic Facilities

While the current seating, tables and rubbish bins are appreciated, there is need for more of these placed in strategic positions throughout the woodland.

## 7. Signage

There is need for a "you are here" sign in the corner of Nancy's Woodland, alongside the recently surfaced path by the roundabout. One showing a map of Hagley Park, the Gardens etc is considered desirable.

The above items are not listed in priority, but for future reference. We look forward to being kept informed about progress.

Finally, we appreciate the support of both Boards with our barbecue project. Fund raising is continuing and we are hopeful of a satisfactory result. Thank you for your ongoing support."

**Recommendation:** That the information be received.

### 14.3 JOHN RHIND - LETTER OF APPRECIATION
