

### 3. DEPUTATIONS BY APPOINTMENT

#### 3.1 New Zealand Police

Dave Lawry, Area Controller NZ Police would like to address the Board to present the Annual Policing results for the Hagley/Ferrymead area. The report has been circulated separately.

The results include:

- 22% reduction in recorded burglaries to a total of 1092 during the year.
- A reduction in recorded violence and sexual attacks of 3.48%
- A reduction in unlawful takings of 21%
- A reduction in recorded family violence at 10,000 family units of 21.8%
- Burglary resolutions, ie burglaries for which the offenders have been located rose from 12% to 15.6%. There is still some data to come in for the month of June.
- Through management, sick leave has a 25% reduction
- Traffic requirements (as purchased via the Safety Administration Programme, and includes a range of traffic related activities) Hagley/Ferrymead achieved all its traffic requirements and in fact continued to 123% productivity which resulted in the District coming in at 101%.
- There is a required contact rate of 2 contacts per hour, our members achieved 3.35.
- Productivity is measured via various codes recorded in a system called AMS and a total of 1550 hours per member per year is required. Hagley/Ferrymead members achieved 1648 hours, which is a 2% increase of productive hours per member.
- Training of 80 hours per year is required – we achieved 81.3.
- Other positive indicators are through various budget challenge processes. The Hagley/Ferrymead budget has been increased by \$144,000 in respect of operational funds.
- Several major enquiries were resolved, for example the Godley Homicide and the Shannon Homicide and there has been a considerable amount of funds spent in the Watchhouse area (the prisoner holding area) to reduce the suicide risk by eliminating various dangers within the cells. This is an ongoing process.
- One issue throughout the year has been the inability to replace senior sergeants and the sergeants due to resourcing issues. However the senior sergeant issue has now been resolved and Hagley/Ferrymead is almost up to strength.
