It was not economically viable to have two staff members cover this period for so few children. The parents were very happy with the programme with Science Alive being the favourite outing for the children.

This programme was contracted to Phillipstown Community Centre, which has previously run in partnership with the Linwood Community Arts Centre. This partnership did not happen these holidays but will be incorporated in future with the Linwood Community Art Centre. The Supervisor also recommended to ultilise the school hall in future as activities at the Community Centre are restricted due to the size.
