6. REGIONAL WASTE MINIMISATION STRATEGY - FEEDBACK

The purpose of this report is to summarise the outcome of the first meeting of the working group.

BACKGROUND

On 2 September the Subcommittee resolved that the Constituting Agreement Review Working Party be requested to prepare a strategy and budget for regional waste minimisation, and that it report back to the November 2002 meeting of the Subcommittee. (As the Constituting Agreement has been developed, this working group could be renamed the *Regional Strategy Working Group*.)

The Working Party held its first meeting on 25 October, and resolved to invite any interested representatives from member councils to attend future meetings. The outcomes of the meeting were:

- 1. A request that all territorial local authorities provide updated information on volumes recycled, recovered and reused.
- 2. A request for all territorial local authorities to provide copies of respective waste management plans to be circulated at next Subcommittee meeting.
- 3. Three projects were identified (discussed below) for this financial year. The next meeting of the working group on 3 December will develop a strategy for the 2003/04 financial year, and as per the new Constituting Agreement this draft strategy will be circulated to member councils for approval.
