17. BURWOOD/PEGASUS COMMUNITY FACILITIES ANNUAL REVIEW 2002

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The purpose of this report is to provide a review on the usage, management, and financial operations of the Council-owned community facilities in the Burwood/Pegasus area for the 2002 year.

This report is in the new format was recommended by the project team for the review of the management guidelines for community facilities. The report indicates usage of the facilities by user group, activity, frequency, numbers, and whether or not the users are local residents. The new format does not record percentage usage. The last annual review in the old format was reported to the Board on 12 August 2002.

Responsibility for community facilities has now been transferred to the new Community and Recreation Unit, and a six month project position has been established for completion of the review of management guidelines.

A directive from the Legal Services Unit has prevented the local development of management agreements or lease documents.

ARANUI COMMUNITY HALL

Aranui Community Hall is managed by a subcommittee of the Aranui/Wainoni Senior Citizens Club. In 2002 the Chairperson resigned because of continuing ill-health. A new Chairperson and subcommittee members representative of various user groups were voted on to the committee at the Annual General Meeting on 28 May 2002. The committee is a registered incorporated society.

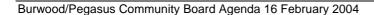

Financial

Charges

\$5 -10 per hour. Functions are charged at \$10 per hour, plus \$5 if the supper room is required. No bond is required.



Income and Expenditure

Income for 2002 \$5,927.28 Expenditure \$4,156.00 Surplus \$1,771.28

Any surplus is used for running costs and internal maintenance. In 2002 the electric range was replaced and repairs to doors were carried out.

The Bookings/Cleaning officer is paid an honorarium of \$200 per month.

Promotion

The committee would like assistance with promoting the hall and with developing management and maintenance plans. Committee members would be happy to attend any management training available.

Improvements carried out in 2002

Repairs to windows in men's toilet, replacement of panels on doors, and replacement of lights in small hall.

Maintenance

The front of the hall and the entrance are unwelcoming. The hall requires treatment for borer. The windows need replacing with glass, not with perspex. Spouting needs replacing. Graffiti has not been attended to. Heaters have not been serviced for 2-3 years, and require new filters. The Council has installed storage lockers, but the locks are inadequate.

ASCOT COMMUNITY CENTRE

Ascot is managed by a committee which has been in place for some years, and members represent some of the user groups. It is an incorporated society. The financial year is from January to December, and the Annual General Meeting was held in August 2002.

Financial

Charges

All groups pay \$8.50 per hour. Functions are charged at \$120 per night, and \$30 extra if crockery is required. There is a \$200 refundable bond.

Income and Expenditure

Income for 2002 \$3,891.68 Expenditure \$3,509.49 Surplus \$382.19 Accumulated funds in \$6,476.68

Westpac Accounts

Any surplus is banked, until repairs or maintenance are identified.

In 2002 the hall committee provided a Christmas party costing \$124.67. This was accounted for under expenditure.

Honorariums are paid to the Chairman, the committee member who is Secretary and Treasurer, and the bookings and cleaning officer.

Promotion

The Committee would like assistance to promote the Centre. It is believed that the public still see the Centre as part of the golf course.

Maintenance

The Centre needs replacement carpet and painting, and more chairs, and would be enhanced by having picnic tables outside.

An account for excess water use was received of \$358; one toilet is leaking, and paint has lifted.

WAINONI/ARANUI FAMILY CENTRE

The Wainoni/Aranui Family Centre is managed by a committee made up of representatives of some of the user groups and local residents. The committee is an incorporated society. The end of the financial year is 31 August, and an Annual General Meeting was held on 11 October 2002.

Financial

Charges

Charges are \$10 for the first hour, and \$5 thereafter. Functions are charged at \$70-90, with heating and use of cooking facilities extra. A bond of \$200 is charged for functions.

Income and Expenditure

Income for 2002 was \$11,483 Expenditure \$11,483

In 2002 \$1764.29 was spent on providing new curtains, and this amount was included in the accounts under expenditure: repairs and maintenance. There was no deficit or surplus. This is achieved by transferring funds to the main account from accounts called: Youth; Music; and Refurbishment.

The balance in hand from all accounts in 2002 was \$3,800.

An honorarium of \$200 per month is paid to the committee member who does the bookings. The cleaner is paid \$9.75 per hour for seven hours per week cleaning.

Improvements

The hallway requires repainting and recarpeting.

SOUTH NEW BRIGHTON SCHOOL HALL AND COMMUNITY CENTRE

The South New Brighton Community Centre is managed under the umbrella of the South New Brighton School's Board of Trustees, and administered by a secretary employed by the school. It is well used by both the school and the community. The financial year is from January to December.

The Administrator is paid for two hours per week at \$25.78 per hour.
