## 19.4 INTERACTIVE ARTWORK PROJECT (PROCEEDS OF WAIMAIRI STUDY AWARDS SPECIAL FUND)

A meeting was convened on 17 December 2003 by the Fendalton/Waimairi Community Board to consider an interactive artwork project to be funded from the residual funds of the Waimairi Study Awards Special Fund. A budget of approximately \$69,000 is available to fund the project.

Given the area covered by the former Waimairi District Council, an elected member from each of the affected boards was invited to attend the meeting to consider an appropriate location for an interactive artwork within the boundaries of the former council's area. Don Rowlands attended the meeting on behalf of the Burwood/Pegasus Community Board.

The resulting discussions identified a number of possible locations. The following four sites were to be evaluated by staff for reporting back to the working party early in 2004:

- Bishopdale Shopping Centre.
- Burnside Park.
- · Fendalton Service Centre/Library.
- Groynes Reserve.

## 19.5 COMMUNITY FACILITIES MANAGEMENT GUIDELINES

David Coom, Community Services Team Leader, has advised that Paul McOscar, Community Development Adviser (Fendalton), has been seconded to continue the review of management guidelines and their implementation. This will continue the good work of Sue Cobb and other staff in developing management practices for community centres.
