2. CITY PLAN MONITORING

4. SECONDARY FUTURES (EDUCATION)

Secondary Futures is a project established to create a vision for secondary education, looking out 20 years. It is a new model funded by the government but run by the following Guardians: Professor Mason Durie (Chair), Gillian Heald, Ian Taylor and Bernice Mene. The Guardians have been charged with having wide-ranging discussions across the education sector and beyond, talking to people with an interest in the debate shaping education policy for the future.

Secondary Futures has developed a unique set of tools and process to help people think about the future as part of their work leading the OECD's "Schooling for Tomorrow" project. This system is being used now in a number of different sectors in New Zealand – such as the business, tourism and environmental sectors, and as far away as Scotland.

Gillian Heald (Guardian) and Nicola Meek (Chief Executive) will lead the presentation.
