#### **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for an application for funding from the Community Board's 2007/08 Youth Development Scheme.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- 2. The applicant is Telusa Veainu, a 17 year old St Andrews student living in Bishopdale.
- 3. Telusa has been selected for the Canterbury Under 19 Boys team to compete in the New Zealand Touch Nationals in Wanganui from 29 February to 5 March 2008. Telusa is the oldest of nine children and was awarded a full rugby scholarship at St Andrews College from Year 9. He has been identified as an up and coming rugby player and is in the New Zealand development squad.
- 4. Along with being a talented sportsman Telusa has been named as a school prefect, acknowledging his leadership skills and academic achievements.
- 5. Telusa was also selected for the Canterbury Team to compete in the recent South Island Championships, however due to the family's financial situation he was unable to participate. He works part time in order to contribute towards the cost of sporting trips but advises that study and sports practise take up most of his time.
