PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval (via this Committee) for funding from the Board's 2008/09 Discretionary Fund for the Riccarton High School to construct a pathway from the Upper Riccarton Community Library to Riccarton High School's new whare.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. This project will potentially result in some public benefit by having the pathway between the Upper Riccarton Community Library and the Riccarton High School whare as it will allow prearranged groups to access the whare more easily. This may enhance the benefits of the school having a whare through greater engagement with the Maori community, and other community based users of the whare. The path will also be used by attendees at the schools community night classes.
- 3. However, the school estimates that approximately 80% of the users of the path will still be Riccarton High School pupils rather than the general community.
- 4. Staff consider that as this pathway will be on Ministry of Education land that it should primarily be the Ministry of Education's responsibility to fund this. In addition, staff consider that the school has sufficient funds available to cover the cost of the project.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5. The following outlines budgetary requirements for 2008/09:

The school reports that it has \$7,422 set aside to meet the shortfall. In addition, at the date that this application was submitted, the school had \$1,075,462 available in unallocated funds.
