8. REDCUP 2007 LIMITED – LEASE

PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Spreydon/Heathcote Community Board's recommendation to the Council that it approves:
 - (a) The surrender of the existing lease with Redcup 2007 Limited.
 - (b) Enters into a new lease with Choffy Limited.

and that the Corporate Support Manager be given delegated authority to approve the new lease.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. The current tenant (Redcup 2007 Limited) has decided to move on and rather than assign the lease to a specific party they decided to tender the remainder of the term of the lease. (Three years with the lease expiring on 22 August 2011.)
- 3. A director of Redcup 2007 Limited has advised that a successful tenderer has been found (Choffy Limited) who he feels meets the Council's criteria.
- 4. As the existing lease has only three years to run the Property Consultancy Manager is recommending that the current lease is surrendered by Redcup 2007 Limited and that a new lease is entered into with Choffy Limited.
- 5. The reasons behind this recommendation are twofold.
 - (a) In the normal course of events the existing lease would run until it expired on 22 August 2011. At that point the Council would tender a new lease which would cost the Council time and money. By tendering the lease Redcup have saved the Council this expense and this meets the Council's objective in terms of publicly notifying that a lease is available.
 - (b) With the surrender of the current lease the Council is in a position to review the terms and conditions and make appropriate changes. By engaging in this process the lease would be updated to meet current commercial conditions.
- 6. The successful tenderer is Choffy Limited whose directors are Elizabeth Symons and Peter Lord who have experience in setting up and operating a restaurant. On checks carried out by staff the Directors would meet the requirements under the terms and conditions set out in the current Auckland District Law Society Deed of Lease. The Directors will also provide personal guarantees.
- 7. It is proposed that once agreement is reached the Council enter into a lease on the following terms.
 - (a) A term of three years with three rights of renewal of three years, a right to be exercised by the Tenant.
 - (b) Rent reviews will be carried out every three years.
 - (c) A base rent will be \$18,000 per annum plus GST.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8. The Revenue from the rental will increase from current levels by \$1,780 per annum plus GST.

- (d) That Redcup 2007 Limited and Choffy Limited meet all costs associated with the lease surrender and drawing up the new lease.
- (e) That the Corporate Support Manager be given delegated authority to approve the new lease.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek authorisation from the Spreydon/Heathcote Community Board to set aside \$7,500 from its 2008/09 Discretionary Fund for the purposes of the Youth Achievement Scheme.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. The Youth Achievement Scheme provides small grants to eligible individuals. The purpose of the scheme is to celebrate and support young people living positively in the local community by providing financial assistance for their development. Applications to the fund will be considered in the following categories:
 - Educational Studies This can include personal development opportunities such as leadership skills, career development and skills training, or community based educational studies.
 - Cultural Studies This can include courses or seminars such as Te Reo lessons, musical training, arts colloquiums etc. It could be for attendance at cultural events taking place locally, nationally or internationally.
 - Representation at Events To provide support or assistance to those who have been selected to represent their school, team or community at a local, national or international event. This includes sporting, cultural and community events.
 - Recreational Development Assistance to attend or take part in one off or ongoing recreational events or participation at recreation or sporting development. For example advance ballet classes in Wellington, representing Canterbury at rugby.
 - Capacity Building Providing support for personal development or growth. For example leadership training.
- 3. Applicants to be eligible will also need to meet the following criteria.
 - Age groups 12-25 years.
 - Projects must have obvious benefits for the young person and if possible the wider community.
- 4. Applicants will also be required to complete the application form attached (Attachment 1) and provide the additional material noted on this.
- 5 Applicants will also be asked how long they and their parents/caregivers have lived in Christchurch. This will allow Board members to take into consideration whether the funding requested is commensurate with the historic contribution of the applicant and their family to rates in this city.
- 6. It is recommended that individuals only be allowed to apply once per financial year and twice in total.
- 7. In making recommendations to the Board staff will make comment on the following matters:
 - The extent of additional funds that the individual/group has sourced from other funders, and the amount of fundraising undertaken.

- The level of excellence at which the group or individual is performing in their chosen field.
- The socio-economic status of the group or individual and their capacity to meet the costs they are seeking from their or their families own resources.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 8 In the 2007/08 financial year the Board allocated a total of \$7,260 grants from this scheme (Attachment 2).
- 9 This proposal to continue with this scheme means transferring funds from the Board's Discretionary fund into a separate Youth Achievement Scheme fund. This reduces the total amount available in the Boards Discretionary fund in 2008/09 to \$52,500.
