PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to present to the Shirley/Papanui Community Services and Events Committee four applications for funding from the 2008/2009 Youth Development fund.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. **Attached** is a table summarising the applications for funding from the Youth Development fund. The total cost of projects is \$9,274 with \$3,710 of this being requested from the scheme by the following:

- 3. The Board has \$7,140 available for distribution for youth development purposes. The Community Recreation Adviser has made recommendations totalling \$2,600. However; the final decision relating to funding belongs with the Community Services and Events Committee.
