2. **NEIGHBOURHOOD WEEK – CONSIDERATION AND ALLOCATION OF 2008/09 FUNDS**

At its meeting held on Wednesday 17 September, the Board resolved to:

- (a) delegate authority to this Committee, for the remainder of the Board's term, to consider applications and allocate Neighbourhood Week funds, from the Strengthening Communities Fund approved for that purpose.
- (b) schedule this extraordinary meeting of the Committee, so that the maximum time possible is given to convey the decisions to the applicants to then allow them to organise their Neighbourhood Week event.

Applications closed on Friday, 5 September; **64** were received, and have been summarised onto the **attached** spreadsheet.

Through the 2008/09 Strengthening Communities approval round the Board has set aside \$10,000 for Neighbourhood Week.

Total funding sought is **\$11,161.54**.

The Board has reaffirmed its intentions that eligible applications are to be for 'not for profit' events, and that a per head subsidy amount be applied to each decision.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee, acting under delegated authority, give consideration to, and make decisions on, the attached Neighbourhood Week applications for 2008.

Things You Need To Know:

Grants are available for reimbursement after the event and following the presentation and approval of receipts. Please note that funding is not available for alcohol or fireworks.

Small Subsidy:

A small subsidy towards cost for Neighbourhood Week is currently allocated by each of the Community Boards for allocation to help support Neighbourhood Week events. The following criteria applies:

Intention of Support

- Neighbourhood Week funding is seen as a small contribution towards holding an event. Because it is intended to 'bring neighbours together' applications from individuals getting together and holding a local event will take priority over organisations.
- Neighbourhood Week funding should not be seen as a way for individuals or organisations to hold an event that they would at other times of the year.
- It is expected that those holding the event will contribute in some way towards the event, even if it is through supplying some of the materials.

Dates of Events

- While there are set dates for Neighbourhood Week, we understand that not all events can take place within designated dates. If you wish to have your event outside these dates, please provide an explanation on your application form.
- Please note priority will be given to events that fall within Neighbourhood Week as opposed to other times of the year.

Numbers of People per Event

While there are no limitations on numbers attending Neighbourhood Week events, it should be remembered that the main purpose of Neighbourhood Week is to bring neighbours together to get to know each other and therefore events with too small or too large numbers may be less successful in achieving this.

Conflict of Events

- Where two events are to be held in a close locality (ie same street or park), we will encourage you to combine these events.
- Where two or more people apply separately for the same event, these applications will be considered together.

Residents Association's

Resident Association groups can apply unless they have applied for funding from a previous round for a Neighbourhood Week event.

Community Board Reimbursement:

Once you have been notified in writing of your application approval, the individual(s) organising your event must pay first, then provide receipts attached to the 'Small Subsidy Receipt & Evaluation Form' that will be posted to you in order for the board to reimburse your small subsidy.

The Process:

Once you have decided to participate with Neighbourhood Week, here are the steps to take:

- 1) Get your neighbours together.
- 2) Complete the on-line application form attached below or pick up a hard copy from your local service centre.
- 3) Fill out the application form and submit via email, post (details as mentioned below) or drop in to your local service centre prior to the deadline of 5 September 2008 at 5pm.
- 4) Once applications have closed these will be presented to the community boards for approval or decline. You will be notified of the decision made by your community board.
- 5) Your event will be held. (Take lots of photo's and have a great time!)
- 6) Complete the Small Subsidy Receipt & Evaluation Form and include your receipts.
- 7) The board will reimburse your allocated subsidy.
- 8) Forward any digital photo's to us as we would like the opportunity to download your fun photo's into the Neighbourhood Week Gallery.
- 9) Get going...!
