PART B - REPORTS FOR INFORMATION

1. STAFF BRIEFINGS

1.1 HERITAGE AWARDS

Roger Cave, Community Engagement Adviser briefed the Committee on the processes for the Heritage Award event and the judging panel.

Members noted the following:

- Ongoing communication was needed between staff and the Committee on information being forwarded to the public.
- Members to advise each other what areas they have covered and which houses have been visited.
- A list of properties which have already received a Heritage Award will be circulated.
- The Papanui Heritage Group and the St Albans Heritage Group are currently visiting houses to assess them for heritage value. Copies of the Heritage Award brochure have been supplied to both groups.
- The award plaque etching colour be either white or gold.

2. ACHESON AVENUE ONE-STOP-SHOP

The Committee considered a report which recommended that the renewal of the lease at 25 Acheson Avenue One-Stop-Shop not be renewed and that the Corporate Support Unit Manager be asked to use his delegated powers to take that action.

It was **agreed** that the Corporate Support Unit Manager be requested to use his delegated powers to not renew the lease on the property at 25 Acheson Avenue which is currently leased for the One-Stop -Shop.

3. NEW ZEALAND COMMUNITY BOARD'S 2009 BEST PRACTICE AWARDS

The Committee considered a memorandum seeking the Committee's consideration of nominations for the New Zealand Community Boards' 2009 Best Practice Award.

It was **agreed** that members would advise the Community Board Adviser of suitable projects under the various categories available. This would enable a report to be prepared for the next meeting of the Committee seeking agreement on the project(s), the funding required and to present the Committee's stated preference for an identified consultant to prepare the application(s).

It was further **agreed** that the recent Courtenay Street/Westminster Street Kerb and Channel renewal and Styx River Mouth/Brooklands Boat Ramp development plan consultations and the Groynes Dog Park would be suitable projects to consider for nomination.

4. MEMBERS' INFORMATION EXCHANGE

4.1 STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES FUND

Minutes of the Strengthening Communities Fund Metropolitan meeting of 11 July 2008 were tabled, noting there had been a delay in having these on the Council website. Community disquiet with some of the decisions was reported.

It was noted that Junior Neighbourhood Support had been declined for metropolitan funding. As a representative from that organisation would be speaking at the next Board meeting, members noted that the opportunity was available to discuss the funding decision for that organisation at that time.

4.2 NEW ZEALAND INTERMEDIATE JUMP JAM FINALS

Shirley Intermediate School had entered four teams in this competition, each having done well. Pauline Cotter undertook to send a letter of congratulations to the organising teacher.

It was **resolved** that the Committee establish a Subcommittee of the Community Services and Events Committee with delegated authority to approve urgent applications.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to present a request for funding to the Committee from the Canterbury Cook Island Sports Association Inc. (CCISA). The request is for \$2,500 towards their regular Friday night activities and their annual Sports Weekend in November 2008.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. CCISA has been operating for over 10 years organising and running sporting and cultural activities for the Cook Island community. It's objectives are:
 - To provide and promote recreational and sport activities both culturally and spiritually.
 - To encourage, promote and support the young and old people to achieve the highest goals within their individual ability.
 - To maintain local recreational and sporting contacts within the region with an open view to compete socially with outside sporting groups as well as cultural groups.
- 3. Although the group's name has "Canterbury" associated with it, the majority of their members live in the Shirley/Papanui Ward (70%) and they run activities in this Ward. The total number of people involved ranges between 100 and 200.
- 4. This request has two parts to it:
 - (a) A contribution towards their regular Friday night cultural activities; and
 - (b) Assistance with costs of the annual Sports Weekend (held during Show Weekend in November).
- 5. The Friday night cultural evenings are held at the Shirley Community Centre and involve; language, singing, dancing and drumming. This venue has proved to be very useful to the group as it does not have close neighbours meaning that the noise of the drumming is not disruptive. It is also easily accessed by the group's members, many of whom are able to walk to the venue.
- 6. The Annual Sports Weekend has evolved into an event hosted every second year by this group, with the other year being hosted by the Ashburton Cook Island community. The events are held at Mairehau High School and the Papanui Club. The weekend involves:
 - touch
 - netball
 - volleyball
 - tennis
 - golf
 - table tennis
 - pool
 - darts
 - basketball.

Many of the sports are set-up specifically for children and youth.

7. Although the group has been in existence for over 10 years, it did go into a down time for a year or so due to one of the main leaders moving to Hamilton. This leader was also the coordinator for the Mato-Oi Group which ran the cultural events on Friday night. As a result Mato-Oi merged with CCISA who now run the Friday evening cultural sessions. The Friday evening sessions have begun again this year and the Sports Weekend was held in Ashburton last year.

- 8. In terms of the costs associated with the Friday evening cultural activities the major cost to the group is venue hire at \$2,938 per year. The budget for the Sports Weekend is \$1,000 giving a total cost to the group for the year's activities of \$3,938. This is broken down as follows: Venue hire (\$540), Volunteer expenses (\$100), equipment hire (\$360).
- 9. The group presently has approximately \$1,400 in the bank and is putting \$1,000 of this towards these two activities over the 2008/09 financial year.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to present the Youth Development fund applications for funding in the 2008/09 financial year to the Committee. The **attached** table also includes the recommendations for allocation made by the Community Recreation Adviser.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. Attached is a table summarising the application for funding via Youth development fund within the Shirley Papanui ward. The total cost of projects is \$375 with \$325 of this being requested from the scheme. The Committee should note that while five youth will be attending the same event, the funding requested is on an individual basis.
- 3. The Board has \$9,400 available for distribution for development purposes. The Community Recreation Adviser has made recommendations totalling \$105. However, the final decision relating to funding belongs with the Committee.
