PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for an application for funding from the Community Board's 2009/10 Youth Development Scheme.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The Christchurch City BMX Club has two members that live in the Riccarton/Wigram area that are applying for funding assistance to compete at the World BMX Championships in Adelaide from 15 – 28 July 2009.
- 3. Shannon Alexander is a 14 year old Hornby resident and is unbeaten in her age groups within New Zealand for the past two seasons. Shannon won a Bronze medal at the 2008 World Championships in Beijing and is currently ranked number one in New Zealand and number three in the world. Campbell Pryce is 12 years old and resides in Templeton and regularly finishes in podium positions in South Island competitions. This year Campbell is striving for a place in the Junior New Zealand test team.
- 4. Preparation for the upcoming World Championships has involved travelling to Australia, Auckland, Gisborne, Taranaki to race and the team also competed in Whangarei over Easter 2009. The short term goals for these athletes are to test themselves and compete well at the World Championships, which is the highest level possible. Gaining selection for New Zealand to compete at the Olympic Games is the long term goal for these riders.
- 5. The riders have been actively fundraising through numerous sausage sizzles, raffles and chocolate selling and they will continue to fundraise until July 2009.
