PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for an application for funding from the Shirley/Papanui Community Board's 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.
- 2. There is currently \$2,900 in the 2010/11 Youth Development Scheme.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 3. The purpose of the Youth Development Scheme is to celebrate and support young people living in the Shirley/Papanui ward by providing financial assistance for their development. The Community Board also seeks to acknowledge young people's effort, achievement and potential excellence in the community.
- 4. The Youth Development Scheme will consider applications for the following activities:
 - Personal Development and Growth For example leadership training, career development,
 Outward Bound, Spirit of Adventure, extra curricular educational opportunities.
 - Representation at Events Applicants can apply for assistance if you have been selected to represent your school, team or community at a local, national or international event or competition. This includes sporting, cultural and community events.
- 5. The following eligibility criteria must be met:
 - Age groups 12-25 years.
 - Projects must have obvious benefits for the young person and if possible the wider community.
 - Only one application per person permitted per year.
 - Applicants should be undertaking other fundraising activities and not relying solely on Community Board support.
- 6. **Attached** is a table summarising the applications for funding via the Youth Development Fund. The total cost of projects is \$7,516.70 with requests for support from the Fund being detailed below:
 - Mairehau High School Senior Boys Basketball team –\$1,200
 - Jackson Raymond Brady as much as possible
- 7. The Board has \$2,900 available for distribution for development purposes. The Community Recreation Adviser has made recommendations totalling \$1,450 However, the final decision relating to funding belongs with the Community Board.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8. The Shirley/Papanui Community Board has available \$2,900 from the Youth Development Scheme for allocation.

This is the second application for Jarden-Kurtis Pouwhare and Takere Wihongi-Low, who are part of Mairehau High School Senior Basketball team.

- (ii) Jackson Raymond Brady: \$250 from 2010/11 Youth Development Fund to attend the New Zealand National Provincial Futsal Championships from 21 to 24 July 2011.
