

Types of monitoring


- Consent compliance
- State of the environment
 - Long term
 - Water level & flow; rainfall
 - Water quality
 - Ecosystem health
- Contact recreation
 - Microbiology in fresh & coastal waters used for swimming etc.
- Investigations
 - One over a short period of time off studies in an area



Types of water bodies in the zone

- Lowland spring-fed urban
 - Avon, Styx
- Banks Peninsula volcanics
 - Cashmere Stream
 - Partly the Heathcote
- Alpine river
 - Waimakariri
- Groundwater

- •Prone to sediment from loess on hills








Lower reaches


- •Braided, wide margins

- •Source of groundwater recharge































Ecosystem health

Estuary sediment quality







Estuary post earthquake



11. REGIONAL COMMITTEE UPDATE

5.30PM

PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. To brief the Committee on the work of the Regional Water Management Committee and present key areas of interest for the Committees consideration.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. Regional Committee met on 11 October 2011 for their 11th meeting. They are currently working on the consultation draft version of the Regional Implementation Programme. Four regional priority issues have been identified:
 - Kaitiakitanga
 - Ecosystems and Biodiversity
 - Land Use and Water Quality
 - Infrastructure
- 3. In addition, the Regional Committee is considering the regionally significant features in each Zone and making recommendations from a regional perspective in the RIP. They have previously discussed Hurunui Waiau and will consider other Zones when draft Zone Implementation Programmes are available to help inform their thinking. The Regional Committee is currently in the process of agreeing content in relation to Ashburton, Selwyn-Waihora, Waimakariri Zones.
- 4. From initial discussions on Selwyn-Waihora and Waimakariri Zones, key points of interest for the Christchurch-West Melton Zone Committee are:
 - (a) A cross-cutting list of regionally significant features for Kaitiakitanga has been developed and will be referenced in each zone, with additional features identified as necessary
 - (b) Draft regionally significant features in Waimakariri and Selwyn-Waihora Zones discussed in relation to CWMS Target Areas:
 - (i) Waimakariri River:
 - Ecosystem Health and Biodiversity
 - Natural Character of Braided Rivers
 - Recreation and Amenity
 - (ii) Effects of managing the lower Waimakariri to reduce flooding:
 - Ecosystem Health and Biodiversity
 - Natural Character of Braided Rivers
 - Recreation and Amenity
 - (iii) Groundwater connection between Waimakariri River and aquifers in Christchurch-West Melton Zone that are important for spring fed streams and drinking water supply:
 - Ecosystem Health and Biodiversity
 - Drinking Water Standards
 - (iv) Waimakariri River Plan in relation to Environmental Limits:
 - (v) Economic value of Waimakariri gravel resource in relation to Indicators of Regional and National Economies.

11 Cont'd

- 5. Christchurch-West Melton Zone Committee will have the opportunity to discuss and comment on the draft Regional Implementation Programme before version 1 is finalised in March 2012. It is not anticipated that version 1 will included Zone specific content on Christchurch-West Melton Zone.
- 6. The draft Waimakariri Implementation Programme (ZIP) was released for public consultation in September 2011 and will be finalised in November 2011.
- 7. The draft Selwyn-Waihora Implementation Programme (ZIP) was released for public consultation in October 2011 and will be finalised in December 2011.
- 8. The draft Ashburton Implementation Programme (ZIP) was released for public consultation in September 2011 and will be finalised in November 2011.
- 9. Banks Peninsula Zone Committee held their first public meeting on 18 October 2011.
