PURPOSE OF REPORT

 The purpose of this report is for the Lyttelton/Mt Herbert Community Board to consider three applications for funding from its 2011/12 Discretionary Response Fund. The applications are from the Governors Bay Volunteer Fire Brigade, Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke Inc and the Diamond Harbour Community Association.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- In 2011/12, the total pool available for allocation for the Discretionary Response Fund is \$19,952.06 The Discretionary Response Fund opens each year on 1 July and closes on 30 June the following year, or when all funds are expended.
- 3. The purpose of the Fund is to assist community groups where the project and funding request falls outside other council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations.
- 4. At the Council meeting of 22 April 2010, Council resolved to change the criteria and delegations around the local Discretionary Response Fund.
- 5. The change in criteria limited the items that the local Discretionary Response Fund does not cover to only:
 - (a) Legal challenges or Environment Court challenges against the Council, Council Controlled Organisations or Community Boards decisions;
 - (b) Projects or initiatives that change the scope of a Council project; and
 - (c) Projects or initiatives that will lead to ongoing operational costs to the Council.

Council also made a note that: "Community Boards can recommend to the Council for consideration grants under (b) and (c)."

- 6. Based on this criteria, the applications from the following groups are eligible for funding:
 - Governors Bay Volunteer Fire Brigade
 - Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke Inc.
 - Diamond Harbour Community Association
