PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to seek approval for an application for funding from the RiccartonWigram 2011/12 Youth Development Scheme.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. The Canterbury U18's Boys Tag Football Team has two players from the team that reside in the ward who are travelling to Auckland to compete in the New Zealand Tag Football Nationals. This tournament is being held from 10 11 February 2012.
- Representatives from Riccarton/Wigram ward : Anton Brown aged 16 Lincoln Schaapsmeerders-Noah aged 17
- 4. Tag football is a new growing sport played in Canterbury across all age groups. The game was first introduced four years ago in Canterbury and played at Cuthbert's Green. A home ground was allocated at Broadhaven Park some years later, but following the damage to the ground in the earthquakes, the competition was moved to Parklands Reserve.
- 5. Tag football is attracting many new players in Canterbury and encourages families and parents to get involved by either playing themselves or supporting their children by coaching, managing or refereeing. The National Championships is the highest level of competition available for these players in New Zealand, which involves 66 teams across nine grades competing from around New Zealand.
- 6. In terms of fundraising, the team has found it challenging this time with disruptions of the earthquake and snow, but have raised a small amount to cover miscellaneous items required by the team (strapping tape, first aid kit). They have currently fundraised approximately \$180.
