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PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1. The purpose of this report is for the Burwood/Pegasus Community Board to consider applications for funding from its 2011/12 Discretionary Response Fund to:
 - (a) Project Employment and Environmental Enhancement Programme (PEEEP) for their Healthy Eating Project;
 - (b) New Brighton Anglican Parish for Earthquake Relief- African drumming; and
 - (c) Parklands Ladies Probus Club for trip and venue hire.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. In 2011/12, the total pool available for allocation for the Burwood/Pegasus Discretionary Response Fund is \$77,926. The Discretionary Response Fund opens each year on 1 July and closes on 30 June the following year, or when all funds are expended.
- 3. The purpose of the Fund is to assist community groups where the project and funding request fall outside other council funding criteria and/or closing dates. This fund is also for emergency funding for unforeseen situations.
- 4. At the Council meeting of 22 April 2010, the Council resolved to change the criteria and delegations around the local Discretionary Response Fund.
- 5. The change in criteria limited the items that the local Discretionary Response Fund does not cover to only:
 - (a) Legal challenges or Environment Court challenges against the Council, Council Controlled Organisations or Community Boards decisions;
 - (b) Projects or initiatives that change the scope of a Council project; and
 - (c) Projects or initiatives that will lead to ongoing operational costs to the Council.

The Council also made a note that: "Community Boards can recommend to the Council for consideration grants under (b) and (c)."

- 6. Based on these criteria, the applications from Project Employment and Environmental Enhancement Programme (Healthy Eating Project), New Brighton Anglican Parish (Earthquake Relief- African Drumming), Parklands Ladies Probus Club (Trip and Venue Hire), are eligible for funding.
- 7. Detailed information on the application and staff comments are included in the **attached** Decision Matrix.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8. As at 23 April 2012 there was \$20,148 remaining in the Board's 2011/12 Discretionary Response Fund.
