1.2 NEW BRIGHTON ROAD ROADING PROPOSAL

Geoff Butler and John Wickert from the New Brighton Returned Services Association (RSA) were in attendance regarding the roading proposal for New Brighton Road. They noted that the RSA has been a service club in New Brighton for 70 years providing facilities for returned servicemen and community groups and raising funds for the local area. They highlighted the need of RSA visitors for nearby parking and were opposed to the proposed removal of parking in the area. The RSA has only limited off-street parking. In their view the proposal for cycle lanes was unjustified given the level of current usage by cyclists.

Shirley Foley and Colleen Blackler from the Seaview Lions Club were also in attendance to oppose the removal of parking. The club runs housie at the RSA on Monday afternoons, predominantly for older people. Allowing a temporary exemption to the parking restrictions for the duration of the housie afternoons was suggested by the Club.
