1. ALLOCATION OF 2004/05 PROJECT FUND

Board members considered a report providing background information for consideration in allocating its 2004/05 Project Fund, together with copies of the Board's Objectives and Performance Indicators, Planning Statement and pie chart showing the current year's allocations.

A draft six month review of the Board's outcomes was also tabled to assist in identifying gaps in the achievement of its objectives.

An outline of the Board's traditional allocations during a financial year was provided as follows:

Board members worked through each section of the project proposals put forward for 2004/05, with staff providing comments, and agreed in principle to the following proposed allocations:
