Minutes of the meeting of the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board, held on Tuesday 7 April 2009 at 5pm in the Boardroom at the Sockburn Service Centre 149 Main South Road, Christchurch.

PART A – MATTERS REQUIRING COUNCIL DECISION

1. RICCARTON MAIN DRAIN EASEMENTS – BETWEEN MATIPO AND WAINUI STREETS

PURPOSE OF REPORT

 The purpose of this report to seek the Council's approval to acquire easements for the right to drain water in Gross over private properties at 5, 7, 11, 15 and 17 Dallas Street, 97, 95, 95A, 95B and 95E Matipo Street, and 94 and 96 Wainui Street to facilitate completion of the Riccarton Main Drain Piping Project.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. Between Matipo and Wainui Streets, there are twelve properties currently affected by the Riccarton Main Drain as shown on the plan 500839-01 (Attachment 1), and easements are required to enable the Council to pipe that particular section of the Riccarton Main Drain.
- 3. The Asset and Planning Unit has been planning the Riccarton Main Drain Piping Project for some time. The affected owners have been made aware of the Council's intentions to pipe that particular section of the drain. All resource consents are held to undertake the work.
- 4. Staff have entered into negotiations with all affected owners seeking to reach agreement for an easement, however finality has not yet been reached and construction is planned in late 2009/early 2010. When agreement is reached with each owner, staff require the necessary Council consents to settle the agreements.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 5. A total budget of \$958,516 has been allocated for the Riccarton Main Drain Piping Project. In view of the considerable benefit the piping of this particular section of the Riccarton Main Drain will have on the affected properties, it has been determined that the payment of compensation is not required.
- 6. The only costs to the Council associated with the creation of the easements are survey and legal costs.

7. Yes, as above.

8. The Community Board does not have delegated authority to confirm the granting of the easements. The Community Board does however have recommendatory powers to Council.

9. Yes. The granting of these easements including contract agreements are under standard terms and conditions prepared by the Legal Services Unit.

BOARD RECOMMENDATION

That the staff recommendation be adopted.

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BACKGROUND (THE ISSUES)

- 15. The Council provides and manages 290 kilometres of drains in the city as part of the land drainage network. This network includes box drains that have a life of approximately 40 years. The section of the Riccarton Main Drain between Matipo and Wainui Streets, which is timber lined, is in very poor condition with some sections rated as close to failure in a 2004 survey.
- 16. The Council's Capital Programme for 2009/2010 identifies the piping of this particular section of the Riccarton Main Drain and the necessary budgetary allocation have been made.
- 17. Consultation on the Council's proposal to pipe the subject portion of the Riccarton Main Drain with the majority of the affected owners has been completed and the response has been, in general, positive.
- 18. The benefits to those properties affected by Council's proposal to pipe that particular portion of the Riccarton Main Drain will be significant and it was therefore determined that payment of compensation for the acquisition of the required easements is not necessary.

12. CONFIRMATION OF MEETING MINUTES – 24 MARCH 2009

The Board **resolved** that the minutes of the ordinary meeting of the Board held on 24 March 2009 be confirmed as a true and correct record.

13. CONSIDERATION OF SUPPLEMENTARY ITEM

The Board **resolved** to consider the supplementary report as per clause 3.

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14. EASEMENT OVER RESERVE – ARCON PLAYGROUND

The Board considered a report seeking approval to the granting of a sewer easement in gross over Arcon Playground for the benefit of Enterprise Homes Limited, an adjoining subdividing land owner.

The Board **resolved** to approve an Easement in Gross to convey sanitary sewer over Lot 12 DP 45943 known as Arcon Playground, subject to the following conditions:

- (a) The applicant being responsible for all costs associated with the easement (processing, valuation, survey, legal and registration) and installation of the requisite services, including all Council related costs.
- (b) The applicant pay a performance bond of \$2,000 to the Council (fully refundable less Council costs incurred in relation to the work undertaken on site) and sign a temporary access licence before any construction work commences on site.
- (c) The applicant provide to the Council a surveyed easement plan on which the proposed easement in gross is shown, within three months of completion of the work.
- (d) The consent of the Department of Conservation being sought.
- (e) The Unit Manager Corporate Support being authorised to finalise and conclude any compensation transaction.

15. LOCAL GOVERNMENT "KNOW HOW" TRAINING COURSES – FINANCIAL GOVERNANCE 101

The Board considered a report seeking the Board's approval for interested board members to attend a Local Government New Zealand "Know How" Course – Finance Governance 101, to be held in Christchurch on 7 August 2009.

The Board **resolved** to fund interested Board members that want to attend the workshop. Funding is to be drawn from 2008/09 and 2009/10 operational funds.

16. APPLICATION TO THE RICCARTON/WIGRAM 2008/09 DISCRETIONARY RESPONSE FUND – ANZAC WREATHS

The Board considered a report seeking approval for a funding application to the Riccarton/Wigram 2008/09 Discretionary Response Fund for ANZAC Day Wreaths.

The Board **resolved** to approve up to \$500 from the Riccarton/Wigram 2008/09 Discretionary Response Fund to purchase ANZAC Wreaths.

17. APPLICATION TO THE 2008/09 RICCARTON/WIGRAM DISCRETIONARY RESPONSE FUND – RICCARTON/WIGRAM YOUTH DEVELOPMENT FUND

The Board considered a report outlining to the Board the implications of transferring funds from its Discretionary Response Fund to its Youth Development Fund. At its meeting of 24 March 2009 the Community Services Committee requested the Board to consider transferring funds from the Board's 2008/09 Discretionary Fund to the Riccarton Wigram 2008/09 Youth Development Scheme Fund.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board does not proceed to transfer funds from its 2008/09 Discretionary Response fund to its 2008/09 Youth Development fund because the proposed transfer would not align with the guidelines of the Youth Development Scheme in the Strengthening Communities Funding.

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The Board resolved:

- (a) Not to accept the staff recommendation as the Board believes that there is a need to support youth development within Riccarton/Wigram ward and therefore support that fund accordingly.
- (b) To transfer \$1,500 from the 2008/09 Discretionary Response Fund to its 2008/09 Youth Development fund
- (c) That the Community Services Committee reconsider Vincent Curd's Youth Development Funding Application at their next meeting in light of the reallocation of funds from the Board's 2008/09 Discretionary Fund.

18. APPROVAL OF THE RICCARTON/WIGRAM COMMUNITY BOARD SUBMISSIONS TO THE CHRISTCHURCH CITY COUNCIL

The Board decided at its 3 February 2009 meeting to develop submissions to the Council's Draft Water Supply Strategy and Draft Greater Christchurch Travel Demand Management Strategy.

The Board **resolved** to ratify the Riccarton/Wigram Community Board's submissions on the Council's Draft Water Supply Strategy and Draft Greater Christchurch Travel Demand Management Strategy.

19.1 William Brittan Avenue – Proposed No Right Turn Sign

That a No Right Turn sign be installed on William Brittan Avenue at the right turn exit lane from John Olliver Terrace onto William Brittan Avenue.

19.2 Matipo Street – Proposed Pedestrian Zebra Crossing

That a pedestrian zebra crossing with a raised platform be installed on the Matipo Street left turn slip lane at Riccarton Road.

19.3 Brynley Street Traffic Calming

Helen Broughton moved:

- (a) That the report be received.
- (b) That in relation to clause 9.3 (Brynley Street Traffic Calming) that the Board convene a public meeting with local residents to discuss the preferred proposal in relation to Brynley Street traffic calming project.

The motion was seconded by Mike Mora and when put to the meeting was declared **lost** on Division 1 by 4 votes to 2, the vote being as follows:

That the plan for the Brynley Traffic Calming Project, as tabled, for final design, tender and construction be **approved**.

The meeting concluded at 8.20pm.


