PURPOSE OF REPORT

1. The purpose of this report is to present the report and recommendations of Commissioner Ken Gimblett who was appointed to conduct a hearing on Plan Change 31 to the City Plan.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- 2. Plan Change 31 is a privately requested change that seeks to amend Living 3 Zone provisions and introduce an area of Business 1 Zone on the land bounded by Packe, Purchas, Madras and Canon Streets in St Albans, a site formerly used as an Orion depot.
- 3. The change proposes the retention of a Living 3 zoning but provides for an increase to the permitted height limits for part of the site, and an exemption from the rules relating to continuous building length. It also proposes a 1 hectare Business 1 zoning on the south-western central quadrant of the block that would be used to facilitate the development of a small supermarket and up to 15 small shops so as to meet demand from the residential development generated from the remainder of the Plan Change.
- 4. The Council resolved on 26 June 2008 to notify the plan change. Public notification attracted 16 submissions and Commissioner Ken Gimblett conducted a hearing over three days in June 2009. The Commissioner has concluded that the plan change should be approved subject to some modification. His report and recommendations have been separately circulated.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

5. Approval of the Commissioner's recommendation will not result in any additional expenditure. If an appeal is lodged against the decision the Council would need to be represented at the Environment Court. Such representation can be accommodated within existing budgets.

6. The recommendation will not impose on the LTCCP budget.
