8. CONFIRMATION OF MEETING MINUTES - BOARD MEETING OF 17 NOVEMBER 2009

The Board **resolved** that the report of its ordinary meeting of Tuesday 17 November 2009, be confirmed.

9. ELECTED MEMBERS' INFORMATION EXCHANGE

Mike Wall raised an urgent email requesting consideration and funding support which had been received from Aorangi Primary School. The Living Springs Trust, in partnership with the school, is holding a camp for all Aorangi students as a way to provide an opportunity for the students to come to terms with the recent decision to close the school and for them to have some fun and time together as a group for the last time. The camp is being held on 9 December which did not allow time for a more formal report to be presented to the Board.

Staff informed the Board that it was costing approximately \$100 per child to attend the camp and that the school was seeking sponsorship for this. So far 38 of the 88 students had been sponsored by local business. After some discussion, the fact that the Board has worked in close partnership with the school over many years, the low decile rating of the school, and the fact that the school is facing closure, the Board **resolved** to grant \$2,000 from its 2009/10 Discretionary Response Fund to the Living Springs Trust to sponsor 20 children from Aorangi Primary School to attend the school camp at Living Springs in Governors Bay.

The meeting concluded at 8.34am.
