Dear Sirs

Safe City is the first point in the LTCCP (PAGE 3) but I can not find anything in the PLAN regarding Safety as in Vandalism, arson, graffiti (TAGGING) Boy Racers - Street Racers etc.

There was a lot of NOISE made last year (2009) at the Town Hall meeting of the Safer communities meeting regarding Graffiti - TAGGING. It appears to me nothing much has happened since then, as the usual places in my neighbourhood still get tagged at frequent regular intervals

The Police obviously are not willing to do much about the problem it is up to the City Council to attempt to solve it, if possible:

- Offering Subsidies to Shopkeepers, Business who's windows are etched or building tagged to purchase digital Video Surveillance Recording Equipment at a discounted price and when the offenders are apprehended and prosecuted loan it to a new business, shop etc.
- Set up motion sensitive Video Surveillance Equipment at a number of regularly and frequently tagged location and shift it to a new location when culprits are caught and prosecuted, with meaningful sentences - Not fines as fines seldom get paid.
