What do you want the Council to consider? What specific action you think the Council should take?
Why should this be done?

- ① * Protection and enhancement of wildlife reserves and habitat.
Council should allocate more money for purchase of new reserve/park area rather than spending on existing reserve/parks. This is vital as population growth puts pressure on natural habitats & species.
The estuary and sewerage pond, farm area is under intense pressure from human interference which is affecting wildlife eg roosting shags migrating godwits, feeding oyster catchers etc. This area needs No boardwalks or human recreation incursions. Most councils in N2 have begun predator-proof fencing with success. Suitable areas in ChCh could be godley head peninsula - across from Taylors Mistake to Lyttelton harbour Removal of the Boulder Bay Baches (perhaps swapped to Rotten Row?) & perquin colony established would benefit - tourism, wildlife and area.
- ② * Purchase of new farm parks as in Te Otia farm is great.
Mt Cnty is very short of similar reserves - Glen Affric or Kate Valley could be added to recreation areas.
- ③ * Travis Swamp needs to have additional protection from vandalism now the board walk allows humans access at night. Also cats are predators within the Swamp - perhaps lockable gates or predator fencing
- ④ * Port hills need protection from urban spread - lizard pop's are drastically reduced as housing with pet cats are now high into lizard habitat on Mt Pleasant.
- ⑤ * Dog-walking areas have been restricted in the by-law changes. There is a need for walkways in residential areas that don't compromise wildlife - "cemeteries" could be a good place.
- ⑥ * Water is Precious - Council should subsidise greywater recovery, roof collection, Council needs to encourage this by bulk purchase & allowing residents to purchase & have help to install environmental systems.
