**Your Submission:**

Street Works along Hereford Street and replace rubbish bins with recycling bins along Worcester Boulevard: The Cultural Precinct has benefitted enormously from the street works along Worcester Boulevard to create a calm, pedestrian friendly environment for visitors and locals alike. With the new civic building moving into the Precinct we are aware of the new street enhancements and traffic calming measures proposed for Hereford Street from Cambridge Terrace to Montreal Street. The CP membership encourage the CCC to ensure the stretch of Hereford between Montreal and Rolleston Ave is given the same treatment to support a pedestrian friendly block. There is some concern that the end of Hereford Street will become a car dumping ground as locals try to get to the Civic Offices, with enlarged pavements outside the civic offices, the temptation will be for motorists to move down to the end of Hereford street - thus making a now, relatively quiet end of Hereford Street even more pedestrian unfriendly and unpleasant. Worcester Boulevard rubbish bins: The bins along Worcester Boulevard are elderly, while they serve their purpose, the Cultural Precinct encourage the CCC to investigate the opportunity to place new recycling bins along one of the busiest pedestrian streets in Christchurch. This will serve to give the Boulevard a mini face-lift and show visitors that Christchurch now has a state of the art recycling system. In a recent Regional Visitor Monitor the lack of recycling facilities came out amongst the negative comments about Christchurch. We believe that by placing recycling bins along the Boulevard we will help change the perceptions of visitors that there is no recycling available in beautiful Christchurch - Especially when we love our recycling!
