Charteris Bay Residents Association Submission Form

I support the views and information contained in the Bill Studholme submission finalized in early April of this year after the Residents association meeting in the Charteris Bay Golf Club held on Thursday the 26th of March.

The meeting was unanimous in backing the submission but we were amazed at the City Councils turn about in not supporting the previously agreed timing of the implementation of the Sewage and Water Scheme which was due to start in July 2009.

At the meeting we were addressed by our local regional councilor Claudia Reid who conveyed the current council attitude that there is now no urgency in starting the work. Most of her dissertation was irrelevant to our problem. She back tracked on the reassurances from your own Council Employee Project manager Mr. Mike Shepherd who has addressed us on this matter and given written reassurances as to the commencement date. It's upsetting to hear he is not given the support from the elected councilors who after all are not experts in this field and really only birds of passage! Claudia urged us to make submissions to the CCC

Dr Mark Yetton's report highlights the pollution dangers inherent in the area and mention should be made of the dangers of contamination of the water supply by Birds and Opossums whilst most residents rely on rain collection and storage in tanks subject to sunshine heating which further encourages bacterial and parasite proliferation. Many Charteris Bay residents still boil their drinking water - a third world practice which the City Council cannot be proud of.

Some mention was made of the heavy pollution into Lyttelton Harbour from old septic tanks leaking down from clay banks replete with under-runners and we cannot ignore the inadequate Sewage schemes already operating in the harbour. They merely spin the sewage round in a container tank and then let it go out with the out going tide much of which is returned with the in coming tide to pollute our beaches. Another disgraceful situation which the City Council cannot condone. I understand they have plans to send all harbour effluent and sewage through the tunnel to the Aranui treatment plant.

I do hope the Mayor who should be readily acquainted with the problems of our area can use his compassion and influence to adhere to the previously agreed time table and proceed with the Charteris Bay scheme.
