Submission is made on behalf of myself, my mother Val Wisely and my brother Christopher Wisely - we share ownership of a family bach at Charter's Bay (Bayview Rd) which has been owned for over 30 years and which is intended to be kept in the family for future generations as part of our shared family heritage. We support the submissions and objections of the Charter's Bay Residents Association in relation to the retracted promises to provide sewerage and water supply to Charter's Bay properties in 2010. I wish to speak in support of this submission in May. We, as many other residents have made financial and other significant plans in reliance on the inclusion and specifics of the provision of water & sewerage in the Council's ~~to~~ to be completed in 2010. We object strenuously to the removal of the CBW & WS from the draft LTCCP for 2009-2019. Having already been greatly disappointed by the delays in the provision of these services I will detail specifics in May in person. Briefly however: ① At the time of purchase of the bach there was no functional toilet, but assurances were given that ^{financial} savings should be ^{put into place} made to pay for the connection of these services in time. ② A recycling toilet was installed and although it has been costly in chemicals and unsatisfactory in many ways that have significantly affected our ability to use and enjoy the bach we have endured these for 30 years and looked forward to the promised provision in 2010. This toilet is now malfunctioning and barely useable. The bach therefore is used for day trips only as a result, and no expenses can be offset by rental. ③ Water restrictions add to the difficulties in generating the toilet. Showering is almost negligible, washing of clothes/bedroom/kitchen/bathroom linens impossible. ④ The beach is a huge drawcard and asset for swimming and sailing both of which our family enjoy. The shallow waters make for safe warm water swimming and sailing for a wide variety of generations including young children and elderly. Seepage by sewerage into the Bay would make this intolerable and destroy most of the pleasure all the generations of our family has enjoyed here. The shared family heritage experience is hugely valued by us and we wish to retain this for the future. The expanding size of the family and our ability to share any meaningful time there has been decimated by the current impracticalities. *Clare Corneil*
