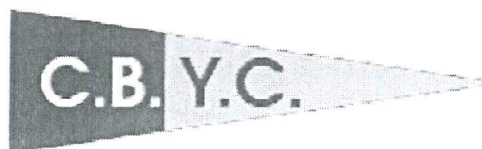

SUBMISSION BY THE CHARTERIS BAY YACHT CLUB

The Charteris Bay Yacht Club ("CBYC") wishes to make the following submission to the CCC's draft Long Term Community Plan for 2009-2019 ("LTCCP") about the Charteris Bay Water and Wastewater Scheme ("CBW&WS"), which was timetabled for completion in 2010, and has been relegated to an unfunded capital project.

- 1 Founded in 1939 the Charteris Bay Yacht Club has a long and valued history. The Club's philosophy is to create an environment which is a safe, family oriented, informal and friendly place for both the young and old to sail.
 - CBYC has an active senior, family, and junior membership totalling 123 members.
 - It is a family focussed club with sailing, and regattas over the summer season. Children routinely swim in the vicinity of the club.
- 2 Over the years CBYC has developed the site, to the extent that it is a valuable place for both provincial and national regattas during the summer sailing season.
- 3 There has been an increasing pressure on the club's sewerage system. The club's septic tank requires regular and increasing maintenance to ensure that there is no discharge into the harbour. The system needs expansion and maintenance to accommodate the increased numbers of people using the clubhouse. Both of these have been delayed in anticipation that there would be a new sewerage system available for the sailing season of 2010 to 2011.
- 4 The increasing use of the clubhouse has also emphasised the urgent need for a reliable water supply. The club collects all rainwater from the roof but this can only provide a restricted supply of water of indifferent quality which, despite self imposed rationing, requires increasing supplementation by water carted in each season
- 5 In the anticipation that the CBW&WS would be commissioned in July 2010 the CBYC has actively pursued a coaching and support programme for junior sailors. This has hugely increased the use of the facilities which is challenging so far as maintaining a safe environment for all the users.
- 6 There is an urgent need for a safe and hygienic sewerage disposal system and a reliable potable water supply. Visitors are surprised that such a splendid sailing area, within the City boundary, can still have third world sewerage and water systems
- 7 The CBYC urges the CCC to reinstate the CBW&WS as promised for completion in 2010.
- 8 We would wish to be heard on the submission.
