The Canterbury Cricket Trust (the Trust) fully supports the draft Long Term Council Community Plan 2009-19 (LTCCP) in respect of the proposal to play Test and provincial cricket at Hagley Oval.

The Trust supports the proposal because:

1. Cricket has suffered considerably during the past ten years with having no appropriate facilities for Test cricket in Christchurch. Until the mid 1990s cricket shared equal rights with rugby at the then Lancaster Park (now AMI Stadium) those rights were enshrined in statute under the Victory Park Board Act 1919.

With the encroachment of rugby into the traditional cricket season by virtue of the Super 14 competition and the necessity to ensure that rugby had appropriate fully refurbished stadia, it was no longer appropriate or possible to play Test Match cricket at AMI Stadium.

The proposed Test and provincial ground at Hagley has been proposed by VBase and cricket wholeheartedly supports that proposal. With appropriate funding from the Christchurch City Council and with appropriate support funding from cricket itself Hagley will provide Christchurch with a world class Test and provincial cricket purpose venue that will be of significant benefit to the Christchurch business, sporting and the community at large.

2. Hagley Oval offers one of the most attractive and aesthetically suitable venues for Test and provincial cricket in this city. The site of Hagley Oval being viewed worldwide as a venue for cricket in this city would, in the Trust's view, have overwhelming social and economic benefits for this country.
3. Hagley Oval is situated in close proximity to the business and hospitality areas of Christchurch. It's proximity mirrors many other famous and successful cricket Test grounds around the world (Wellington, Brisbane, Sydney, Perth, Melbourne, Adelaide, London, Manchester, Nottingham, Birmingham and Leeds to name a few). Hagley's central location would provide significant benefits to the city from tourists, visitors and other local patrons, unlike any other venue located at some distance from the central city. Refer to Wellington city's economic and social benefits as a result of the close proximity of the Basin Reserve and Westpac Stadium to downtown Wellington.
4. The Trust believes that a centrally located facility in the beautiful surroundings of Hagley Oval for international and provincial cricket can only but enhance support for the game including sponsorship and other support that in today's times every sport needs for its healthy continuation and survival.

5. Hagley's central location provides easy access to young and old alike without the necessity of relying on vehicular or expensive transport that venues on the outskirts of town would otherwise demand.
6. Cricket is New Zealand's major summer sport and is our second most popular national sport. In Canterbury alone there are approximately 1,200 teams belonging to the Canterbury Cricket Association and the various clubs and members of Canterbury Cricket Association boast 19,000 members.
