**Your Submission:**

The Naval Point Club represents over 800 members, and provides facilities and events for a wide range of boating activities (sailing, power boating, sea kayaking, waka ama etc). The club has facilities in the Naval Point area of Lyttelton Harbour, which include a club house, storage sheds, launching ramp, parking, trailer boat storage and a haul out area for maintenance. The Naval Point members are passionate about their sport, and are very keen to promote boating and other marine recreation out of the Naval Point area. The Naval Point area is one of the few places where direct access to the Lyttelton harbour is available to the public. It also contains the main launching area for powerboats and is used as a recreation/walking area for the residents of Lyttelton. The area could be a real focal point for the Lyttelton area, and has huge potential for increased recreational value. Currently, and for a range of historical reasons, the area is not well laid out for the range of recreational activities that are undertaken.

Our members see that the Naval Point area is a very valuable recreational asset to the people of Christchurch. We believe that the development of the area can provide key outcomes for the City by way increased recreation, additional areas of public open space, increased community knowledge by diversified recreational activities and by increasing the connectedness of the city with the spectacular marine environment that Lyttelton Harbour and surround provide.
