1) TO CONSERVE WATER USAGE. EACH HOUSEHOLD OR COMMERCIAL UNDERTAKINGS TO HAVE METERED WATER SYSTEMS INSTALLED. THIS ALLOWS THE AUTHORITIES TO GOVERN SUPPLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH DROUGHT CONDITIONS - MAINTENANCE AND ECONOMIC ISSUES.

2) OF SOME SIGNIFICANCE. THE MOA CAVE, MAIN ROAD RESULTS HAS HAD FENCING HURD<sup>1</sup> PROTECTION AT A NEVER ENDING COST TO RATEPAYERS. THE ROCKY SLOPES SHOULD BE SEALED WITH PRIVATE BENTONS MAKING A CONTRIBUTION WITH THE ELIMINATION OF THE CONTINUING COST OF FENCE HIRE.
