Re: Re-kerbing Footpath and Widening of Makora Street

In the year 2000 and again in 2003 residents of Makora Street were promised that with the renewal of Fendalton Road - Makora Street would get re-kerbing done to their street.

However, on the 3/12/2003 the residents were advised by Mr Richard Falloon - Pavement Maintenance Engineer - that Makora Street was no longer on the list.

We are lobbying once again to get Makora Street upgraded. We approached all residents for their support and on the 22/12/08 we had a meeting with Mr Alan Beusenberg and Mr Steve McNeill. We handed to them 36 signatures to support our request.

We will attend the 'session' time on the 1/4/09 at the Fendalton Service Centre. We will also meet in April with the assistance of Sally Buck several board members and residents to look at the problems in Makora Street. These Problems are:

1. Street too narrow for parking on either side of street.
2. Continuous parking from visitors to St Barnabos Church.
3. Same for Fendalton Bowling Club.
4. Ugly electricity poles too close to roadway.
5. Our street is almost the only street left in our neighbourhood which has not been upgraded.

We request that the upgrading of this street is being included in the LTCCP plan and acted upon at the earliest possible time.
