Support:

1. Lyttelton Mt Herbert Community Board submission to, "re-routing heavy traffic off historic Norwich Quay in Lyttelton.

2. Retain in Lyttelton at the foot of the town the historic ferry service to the harbour. A consideration should be given when the re-routing of heavy traffic occurs to construct a usable foot bridge to access the ferries. This was the case until the overbridge was constructed in the early 1960's.

3. Invite the CCC to form a working party to further develop the signal box site and include the important 1898 historic yacht Kiaora as a static display.

4. To establish a small working party to further develop the Baden Norris Reserve . This is a walkway which links Norwich Quay with Sumner Road and Oxford St. It also incorporates on the last piece of public land in what was Reserve 34 (site of Captain Thomas's office, Home of John Godley and the immigration barracks), the former stables area which is crying out for a development strategy. Artist quarters?

This is now over 20 years of making a submission in a similar vein to Council.
