HASTING ST WEST HOUSE OWNERS AND RESIDENCE SUBMISSION

15th April 2009

This is in respect of the following demands placed upon the street:

- Five new housing and unit developments completed within last 12 months
- Three new housing and unit developments in progress
- Bylaw parking on Colombo Street
- 24 hour McDonalds business
- Increased street usage and through traffic
- Ongoing graffiti and rubbish
- Continued lack of road cleaning being completed (gutters)

New Developments:

There are currently 3 new separate developments in various stages happening in the street. This ongoing development continues to impact on the street environment by; the damage trucks have caused to footpaths and roading, increased traffic flow, higher demand for street parking and the noise to residents in the early hours of the morning and residue (eg. soil) left all over the road.

Bylaw Parking:

Restricted parking along Colombo Street by Sydenham Park in the evenings has continued to result in groups of people parking in Hastings Street West. The direct effect on our environment has been a huge increase in rubbish discarded out of vehicles, broken glass and noise (engines and blaring music).

24 Hour Business:

McDonalds 24 hours 7 days a week business continues to impact on our street environment. Increased traffic and ongoing problems mentioned above in regards to rubbish and noise.

Street Cleaning:

Street cleaning is not being completed regularly at the stated 6 week intervals. This is not sufficient especially during the winter months. The deep dish gutters are continually blocked with rubbish, leaves and dirt. This tends to move and compact under the bridges, which causes further problems during wet weather.

Road Usage:

Hastings Street West is consistently used as a through fare from McDonalds customers. McDonalds has a no left hand turn when exiting on to Hastings Street West, this is frequently ignored by motorists. Many of these cars then come down, park up in the street and discard all their rubbish out the car windows. Some even throw their rubbish out the

window as they speed off down the street. This seems to be particularly bad in the winter months.

There are other cars that regularly speed down the street in the evenings and occasionally through the day. Speeds are well above limits.

Road usage has increased dramatically by local residents and street parking has become in high demand, now that the earlier developments from 2008 have been completed. When current developments are finished road usage again will increase.

We realise that replacement of the sewers has been a factor in completion of road upgrades in our street. However, now that these are complete our street is still in need of a major upgrade.

What We Want To See Happen!

- **Regular proper cleaning of the Street**
- **Support in enforcing local business' to take responsibility in cleaning up and keeping areas to a suitable standard**
- **The council encouraging local business to educate their customers in appropriate disposal of rubbish purchased from their premises**
- **Enforcement of fines for people dumping rubbish**
- **Time frames for work to be completed within 1-2 years regardless of any new criteria (this is what was stated to be done by the council 18 years ago), – removal of dish gutters, resealing of footpaths and road.**

Our vision of the Street

The speed ramp removed and replaced by pedestrian and bike through access only such as Hastings Street East.

No Dish Guttering.

Footpaths and road resealed.

To see it narrowed with plantings to enhance the look bringing it in to line with the Boutique City.
