Why should this be done?

- We oppose the sale of the Edgware Pool Site for residential purposes. We want it retained for Community Reereational use.
- Archival records show that the land "was given to the St. Albans Bath Committee to build a Public Bath". At no point has the Community or the Swim Club ever wanted to discontinue this agreement or connection with the site. It is considered "Community Land" and should be reserved for future generations.
  - With the history of fundraising, pool management and maintenance the strength of the Swim Club has been in its people, and the strength of a Community is in its people. The decision by Council should be about land and people, not dollars and cents. Infill housing is producing a denser population in St. Albans. We need to plan now for a sustainable future.
  - Our community vision is one of sustainability and we wish to rebuild a community pool accessible by walking or bike - as the generation before us did.
  - This Community land should be retained to meet the future recreational needs of the <sup>St. Albans</sup> Community - especially learning to swim and Life saving. We have lost our Heritage
