I support the full expansion of the Tramway route to include High Street, Manchester Street and Canal Street at the following locations:

1) Christchurch lacks a number of iconic tourist attractions so necessary to entice tourists extend their stay in Christchurch. The Tram has been a successful "icon" attraction and should be expanded.

2) The regeneration of the central city is important as again it provides a unique and vibrant destination for tourists. The tram will aid this process.

3) The tram provides a tangible connection for Christchurch residents (and particularly its children) with the history of the city that is important in terms of their "sense of belonging" to a community.

Separately I would like the Council to consider some form of tourist connection to Ferrymead and summer beaches - as there used to be.

It could be a tram or if that was too expensive maybe a double-decker bus that could be part of the same ticket. This would let tourists explore more of what Christchurch has to offer.
